

A MESSAGE FROM COUNCILLOR SEAN CHU

Greetings Ward 4 Residents,

Did you know that part of your yard is made up of rights-of-way, and your property line doesn't begin at the edge of the road or sidewalk closest to your home?

The City of Calgary is responsible for managing access to municipal rights-of-way in Calgary. A right-of-way is an area that gives The City space to install infrastructure (e.g. street light poles and trees), while also giving shallow utilities (i.e. power, gas and telecommunications providers) a place to install and maintain their critical infrastructure.

When utility work is required in your community, crews can apply for the permits required to access the right-of-way to install infrastructure, both above and below ground. All properties contain a road right-of-way, but only some properties have a utility right-of-way on them. In most cases, the utility right-of way starts at your property line and extends inward, toward your home.

The space the right-of-way takes up in a yard will vary and it can also be located along the side of your home or at the back. As a homeowner, you are responsible for mowing and general maintenance, but it is technically the road right-of-way and is considered public land. To learn where the right-of-way is located on your property, visit calgary.ca/row.

The City is working hard to ensure Calgarians receive outstanding value for their property tax dollars. We're committed to delivering services that meet Calgarians' needs in the most efficient way possible while continuing to focus on reducing costs and supporting the local economy.

For 2021, your City Council approved an overall property tax rate decrease after \$90 million in savings were found. Approximately 77 per cent of all residential properties will see a reduction or 0 per cent increase in their 2021 property tax. Visit calgary.ca/taxcalculator.

Your property tax bill includes both a municipal and a provincial portion. For residential taxpayers, approximately 63 per cent goes to fund City services such as police, fire, streets and parks, while 37 per cent is remitted to the province of Alberta.

Property taxes are the primary revenue source used to fund municipal programs and services that Calgarians value and use every day. We remain committed to ensuring that Calgarians receive value for their property tax dollars. We're continuously improving and modernizing our services to reduce costs and are seeking innovative new ways to encourage and support Calgary's success. Visit calgary.ca/OurFinances to learn more.

DALHOUSIE STREET SWEEPING

The City's street cleaning program removes sanding materials and debris that has accumulated on roads during the winter months. Residential street sweeping begins April 19, and street sweeping in Dalhousie will be on **June 11th and 15th**. The City's Spring Clean-up is a \$9.8 million dollar program.

The City uses a balanced approach with our Spring Clean-up Program while upholding safety and environmental considerations within communities. Sweeping reduces water pollution by preventing the run-off of sanding materials into our storm water system and reduces air pollution. Clean surfaces also help Calgarians use infrastructure more flexibly and to adhere to social distancing guidelines. **Please watch for the sign shown on the right**

TLC CLEAN UP KITS



DALHOUSIE CRIME ACTIVITY WAS UNCHANGED IN MARCH 2021

The Dalhousie community experienced 12 crimes in March 2021, in comparison to 12 crimes the previous month, and 10 crimes in March one year ago. Dalhousie experiences an average of 12.0 crimes per month. On an annual basis, Dalhousie experienced a total of 144 crimes as of March 2021, which is down 17% in comparison to 173 crimes as of March 2020. Total Dalhousie crimes is calculated as the sum of break & enters (dwelling, commercial, and other premises), theft from vehicles, theft of vehicles, assaults (nondomestic), commercial robberies, street robberies, and non-domestic 'other' violence.

The City of Calgary has approved the Dalhousie Community Center to be host of one of the annual Community Clean Ups! This is a very highly anticipated and well attended event in the NW – it will be held on June 20th, 2021 from 9am-2pm. JOHN LAURIE BLVD UPDATE

Construction is set to start in mid-May 2021 and is anticipated to be substantially completed in October 2021. COMPOST FOR COMMUNITY GARDENS

The City of Calgary is offering up to 10 cubic yards of Screened Category A compost to all community gardens in Calgary that can be used as a soil amendment for vegetable and flower beds. Please note this is separate from compost giveaway events for residents. If your community garden is interested, please complete the attached community gardens compost request form and email form to both contacts on the request form. Once the application has been received, a City representative will contact the community organization to schedule the pickup of the compost.

Organizations are responsible for arranging a transport vehicle to pick up the compost from one of the following



locations:

East Calgary Waste Management Facility – 3030 68 St SE
 Spyhill Waste Management Facility – 11808 69 St NW

Please note:



Compost is loose, no bags or totes will be provided.
Limited quantities of compost are available.
Pickup location will be assigned by a City representative.

Loading Requirements:

• Organizations picking up small volumes of compost in personal cars, trucks or trailers will need to bring their own shovels and containers/tarps for loading purposes.

• Organizations picking up large volumes of compost can contract a tandem truck and request that The City of Calgary staff use a Wheeled-Loader or Skid Steer to load the compost.

KEEP YOUR RECYCLABLES LOOSE

Put your recyclables in your blue cart loose. Make sure your recyclables are not packed too tightly or they will not fall out of the cart during pickup. The only recyclables that should be in bags are bagged plastic bags and bagged shredded paper.

Don't put recyclables in black garbage or blue recycling bags. The recycling facility isn't set up to unbag recyclables and they need to be loose to be sorted by the machines. For the safety of workers, garbage bags are marked as garbage and are not opened.

Weekly green cart pickup is returning at the end of April. Visit **calgary.ca/collection** to check your schedule and sign up for reminders, or download the Calgary Garbage Day app.

Here are some tips for using your green cart:

- All food scraps, food-soiled paper, pet waste and yard waste go in the green cart.
- Use only certified compostable bags or paper yard waste bags in your green cart no plastic bags.
- Always fill your green cart first, then fill paper yard
 waste bags. Roll tops of bags closed and set at least two
 feet to the side of your green cart.
- No plastic plant pots or bedding trays in the green cart. Rinse out and recycle in your blue cart instead.

BEGINNER'S GARDENING TIPS!

- Pick the right spot it is helpful to know where your yard/area you have your garden drains, how much sun/shade it gets, and what the soil is like are factors to consider
- Is water nearby not only the environmental elements should you think of, but also consider where your source of water is so it isn't too far away
- Start with great soil and fertilizer read the instructions on potting soil, mix, and fertilizer
- Consider using potting containers depending on what you are trying to grow!





- Read the backs of the seed packets it is important you have a suitable "home" and wont' be set up for potential disappointment
- Discover your zone Yes! Alberta has gardening zones, you can find out more online through a quick Google search
- Learn your frost dates and what to do if unexpected frost comes
- Add some mulch/compost to your dirt

SPRING CLEANING TIPS!

Already overwhelmed with everything to clean and prep now that Spring is here? Who doesn't! Here are some helpful tips to help navigate your spring cleaning this year (and maybe prepare for the DCA Parade of Garage Sales and Parking Lot Sale?!)

 Do one room at a time. Don't move on until it is done – top to bottom, all drawers declutters, unused items donated/sold/discarded, etc.

 Always vacuum any room's surfaces before wiping and organizing, and then after. If you don't you are spreading around dirt and making mud that is harder for yourself to clean!
 Read. The. Instructions. Don't wreck a surface just because the cleaner wasn't made to be used on it. Save yourself time, money and frustration!

My mother held John's hand, holding it for the moment she was able, feeling the feeble squeeze of his fingers. Her instinct, I know, would have been to stay there at his side, providing the emotional care he needed in his last hours. Other patients though, needed medication, dressings changed, and hands held, if only for the smallest moment.

She would come home, exhausted, shed her nurse uniform and move to the kitchen to nourish her family. Dad would be on the road, doing his part, calling home every few days from a hotel phone when he could. Tummies full, my brother and sister and I would make our way to bed. Mom would distribute hugs, stories and "tuck-ins" liberally until every fear was resolved and we were sleeping soundly. For us she was more than mom, she was synonymous with "home".

Older now, I see my wife leading others as an expert in her work. I see her rise early, address the most urgent items of her day, and then turn her full focus to our bright-eyed son whose world is only full of amazing possibilities. I see her turn off the computer when he returns from school. Playing, laughing and teaching until it's her turn to give hugs, stories and "tuck-ins". Then back again to her computer to work into the evening, tired but



dedicated to see the job done. For our son she is also "home".

Mother's Day started in May 1908 when after her mother's passing, Anna Jarvis wanted to find a way to honor the sacrifices made by mothers for their children. With the support of a department store owner, the event caught on. Eventually, through lobbying and mass letter writing campaigns, Mother's Day became a nationally recognized day in the US; soon followed by other countries across the world.

The sacrifices are endless. Mothers who cannot be home when they want to be, to make sure their family is sheltered and fed. Mothers who release their personal dreams for a new dream of who their children can be. Mothers who give their time, their sleep, their health, and sometimes even their lives for their children. So, take time this year, to honor the sacrifices of your own mother. Regardless of how big or small. Tell her something specific that you remember, or something you still see now, that makes you thankful for her and all that she has done. And make her Mother's Day a happy one.

THE ORIGINS OF VICTORIA DAY

Victoria Day is celebrated every year in Canada on the Monday before May 25th to mark the birth of Queen Victoria. The holiday is Canada's oldest non-religious holiday. It began in 1845 and was celebrated with picnics, parades, sport tournaments and fireworks. It wasn't observed on the 2nd last Monday of May until the government changed the holiday in 1952.

Here are some interesting facts about the legendary monarch you might not know:

•Queen Victoria was born on May 24, 1819 and ruled the United Kingdom and the British Empire for 63 years, starting in 1837. •Her reign began when she was 18 years old.

•She was originally named Alexandrina Victoria, after her godfather, Tsar Alexander I, but preferred her second name. •She was fifth in the line of succession for the British crown, behind the four eldest sons of George III, including her three uncles and her father.

·She was barely five feet tall – four inches shorter than Queen Elizabeth II.

·She survived multiple assassination attempts.

·She started the trend of brides wearing white and wedding guest not allowed to wear white.

·She and her husband, Prince Albert, started the custom bring trees into the home at Christmas and decorating them.

The May long weekend usually signals the unofficial beginning of summer in Calgary: patio sets come out, barbeques are heated up, and some families head out for their first camping trip. It is usually a good weekend to start planting the garden...if you don't fear the annual May long weekend snowfall!

PLAN NOW: NEIGHBOUR DAY - JUNE 19

Neighbour Day (Saturday June 19) is a yearly celebration of community spirit in Calgary. It started in 2014 in honour of the incredible support and generosity Calgarians showed after the 2013 floods. It's a busy time at the City for planning projects that benefit Calgary communities. Engagement is always an important part of planning any project and there are several engagements underway right now that may interest you.

North Central BRT Study: https://engage.calgary.ca/greenline/brtstudy

As Green Line leaves downtown and crosses the Bow River to 16 Avenue N in the first stage of construction, we know that communities to the north must connect to the transit network and that bus service will need to adapt to the new LRT line. The study will consider improvements from downtown along the existing Centre Street N and Harvest Hills Boulevard route to 160 Avenue N.

North Central Mobility Study: https://engage.calgary.ca/greenline/mobilitystudy

With the addition of the Green Line LRT and North Central BRT, Calgarians are going to move differently throughout Calgary. This study is being conducted to understand how travel patterns may change as a result of Green Line operations and BRT services on opening day and into the future. We will share our ideas on how to improve services for all transportation users and how to protect community livability by reducing cut-through traffic. Your input will help shape the future of mobility in north central Calgary.

DISPOSE OF PET WASTE CORRECTLY!

With the warmer weather finally upon us, you may be cleaning up your yard or outside enjoying the sunshine with your pets. Help keep our city clean by disposing of pet waste properly.



•You can put pet waste and kitty litter (all varieties) in your green cart for composting. For the safety of your collector, put pet waste in a certified compostable bag or paper bag and securely tie/roll closed.

•Never put plastic bags or bags labelled biodegradable in your green cart. These bags do not break down and end up as small pieces of plastic that contaminate the finished compost.

·If using conventional plastic bags to clean up pet waste, please double bag and securely tie closed before disposing of in the black cart.

•Only dispose of pet waste in your own carts. If you want to use someone else's bins, you need to have permission from the homeowner or occupant.

·If you live in a multi-family complex like a condo or townhouse, check with your building owner or manager to see if your compost collection company accepts pet waste.
