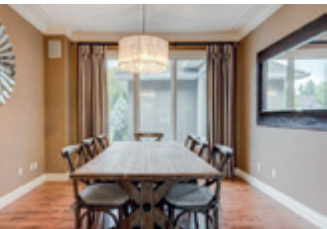

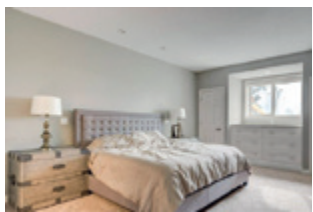
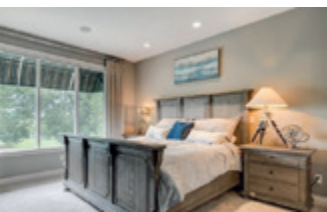

MESSAGE FROM THE BOARD

Planning, organizing, leading, and evaluating (POLE) is a basic management process that not only applies to businesses, but also to non-profit organizations. Some people even apply it to their personal lives! For the DCA, the volunteers and staff that look after each event or program, or combination of programs, have to determine what the goals are, what resources they will need to accomplish those goals, arrange for those resources, implement their plan, and then decide what went well and what could they do better next time.

This cyclical process happens on a micro scale and is applied to every event. For example, in the next few months we have events planned like a community clean-up, a parade of garage sales, and community soccer.

On a larger scale, the DCA has to go through this process on an annual basis, and this coincides with determining the budget for the following fiscal year. For us, this starts in May/ June, the budget is ratified by August, and the program year starts in September.

Every three to five years, we look at the big picture and do some long-term planning. Is our mission (or purpose) still relevant? What about our vision (or ideally, what would we look like?). This May/ June, we are going through this process as well.

You have the opportunity to be involved, to help shape the future of your community. You can give back to your community through sharing your knowledge and skills. Simply contact any of the board members and let them know your level of interest, and they will direct you to the appropriate contact person. Are you able and willing to help?

Bingo cards can be submitted anytime between June 20 and June 30. They can be submitted via email or placed in our mailbox outside the Dalhousie Community Centre. Once all submissions are collected, the DCA will cross reference to ensure that all entries are members, and to confirm the lines on the card. You can submit one bingo card per person that is indicated on your membership form you submitted to receive your membership, however, if there are multiple submissions per membership, you must use different versions of the bingo cards that are available. For example, a family of four with four participating members can complete bingo cards A, B, C, and D. They could not complete four bingo cards labelled A. Bingo cards will be available for download by June 19 on our website.

Each line on your bingo card is one entry into the draw for a \$50 DCA credit to your account, which can be used for almost anything including Out of School Care fees, camp fees, rental fees, and more. It, however, cannot be used for any deposits towards childcare or a rental.

The City of Calgary has approved the Dalhousie Community Center to be the host of one of the annual Community Clean Ups! This is a very highly anticipated, and well attended, event in the NW - it will be held on June 20, 2021 from 9:00 am to 2:00 pm.

While the City trucks will dispose of many items, we are so happy to have TechnoTrash on board to help with the disposal of the following items:

- TV's (LCD, CRT, or plasma)
- Computer Systems
- Computer Accessories (monitors, mice, keyboards, and speakers)
- Computer Parts (cables, cords, fans, power supplies, hard drives for destruction, CPU, ram chips, and boards)
- Laptops, notebooks, tablets, and e-readers
- Printers, fax machines, copiers, and scanners
- Small, Clean Household Appliances: Fans, hair dryers, heaters, irons, microwaves, toasters, vacuums (empty only), etc.
- Audio Visual Equipment: CD players, VCR/DVD players, stereo equipment, cable boxes, satellite equipment, digital cameras, video cameras, etc.
- Networking/Telecommunications Equipment (hubs, switches, modems, routers, and phones), cell phones and chargers, answering machines, etc.
- All Power and Air Tools: Drills, grinders, saws, nail guns, compressors, table saws, etc.
- Games, toys, and music including: Amplifiers, guitars, keyboards, microphones, electric/electronic toys, Video gaming equipment, including game cartridges.
- Wires and Cables (Christmas lights less bulbs)
- Testing equipment, circuit boards

Compost for Community Gardens

The City of Calgary is offering up to 10 cubic yards of Screened Category A compost to all community gardens in Calgary that can be used as a soil amendment for vegetable and flower beds. Please note, this is separate from compost giveaway events for residents. If your community garden is interested, please complete the attached community gardens compost request form, and email the form to both contacts on the request form. Once the application has been received, a City representative will contact the community organization to schedule the pickup of the compost. Organizations are responsible for arranging a transport vehicle to pick up the compost from one of the following locations:

- East Calgary Waste Management Facility - 3030 68 St SE
- Spyhill Waste Management Facility - 11808 69 St NW

Please Note:


- Compost is loose, no bags or totes will be provided.
- Limited quantities of compost are available.
- Pickup location will be assigned by a City representative.

Loading Requirements:

- Organizations picking up small volumes of compost in personal cars, trucks, or trailers will need to bring their own shovels and containers/tarps for loading purposes.
- Organizations picking up large volumes of compost can contract a tandem truck and request that The City of Calgary staff use a Wheeled-Loader or Skid Steer to load the compost.

Father's Day - June 20, 2021

Father's Day is celebrated in many countries around the world as a day to recognize fathers and father figures for the contributions they make to the lives of their children and others. Although it is celebrated on a variety of dates worldwide, many countries, including Canada, the United States, and Mexico, observe this day on the third Sunday in June.

Father's Day is a relatively modern holiday, with the North American tradition generally being traced back to 1910. A bill to accord national recognition of the holiday was first introduced in Congress in 1913, but it was many years before it was officially recognized. In 1966, President Lyndon B. Johnson issued the first presidential proclamation honoring fathers, designating the third Sunday in June as Father's Day. Six years later, the day was made a permanent national holiday when President Richard Nixon signed it into law in 1972. In Canada, Father's Day is not an official public holiday, but is widely celebrated and promoted.

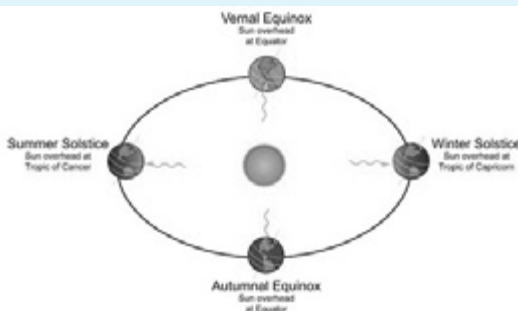
First Day of Summer!

As of June 20, Summer will officially begin in the Northern Hemisphere! Did you know that the first day of summer and Father's Day are on the same day this year? We hope that it is a beautiful day and that there are many ways to celebrate for what could be a great Sunday Funday!

There is more to the first day of summer, other than looking forward to summer activities and warmer weather. Did you know that this is the start of winter for those in the Southern Hemisphere? For example, for friends in Australia, New Zealand, Antarctica, and more!

For those of us in the Northern Hemisphere, Earth is tilting mostly toward the Sun. As seen from Earth, the Sun is directly overhead at noon 23.5 degrees north of the equator, at an imaginary line encircling the globe known as the Tropic of Cancer, named for the constellation Cancer the Crab, its northernmost point. For those who live in the Southern Hemisphere, this is the shortest day of the year and the arrival of winter. The solstice happens at the same moment for everyone, everywhere on Earth.

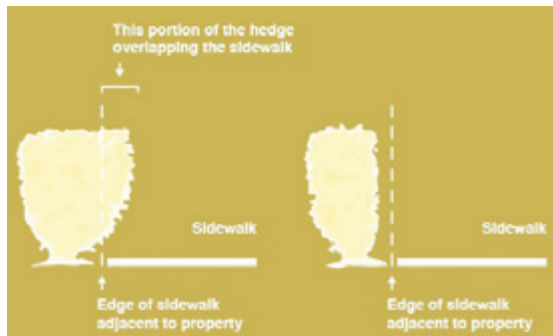

Did You Know...

The City of Calgary's bylaws set a minimum standard for neighbourhoods, helping to ensure all Calgarians live in safe, clean, and healthy communities. Homeowners must keep hedges, trees, and shrubs on their property trimmed so they don't interfere with pedestrians using the sidewalk or vehicles using the street or alley. Ensure trees, shrubs, and hedges are pruned back to the property line or edge of sidewalk and have a height clearance of 15 feet in alleys and streets and eight feet over sidewalks.

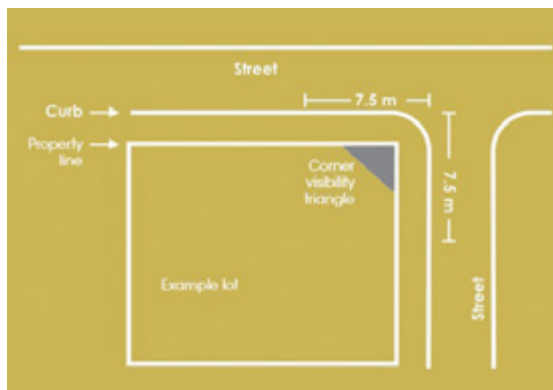

Did You Know...

Hedges, trees, or shrubs must not grow to, or remain at, a height greater than 750 mm (29.5 inches) if located on the corner of a lot within a "corner visibility triangle". Fences, walls, or other structures within a "corner visibility triangle" must also not exceed a height of 750 mm. The "corner visibility triangle" covers an area determined by measuring 7.5 m (24.6 feet) back from the curb corner on each side of your property.

Greetings Ward 4 Residents,

Backyard fire pits, outdoor fireplaces, and wood-burning ovens can be fun, but be sure you're following the rules and staying safe while enjoying them.

Fire pits may only be used:

- Between 10:00 am and midnight, Sunday to Thursday, or
- Between 10:00 am and 1:00 am, Friday and Saturday.

It's also important to be considerate of your neighbours. Outdoor smoke can cause health issues for some people, so consider wind conditions before lighting a fire. High winds can cause smoke to travel a long distance and can be a fire risk, whereas low wind speeds don't disperse smoke and can contribute to poor air quality.

- Firepits must be built into the ground, on brick or stone, or in a fire-proof container.
- Portable firepits should never sit directly on a wooden surface like a deck. Firepits must also be at least two metres away from your property line, house, garage, or fence and they cannot be under trees, branches, plants, or other flammable materials.
- Fires must be less than one metre high and wide, and a mesh screen or spark guard is required to reduce the spread of sparks and embers.
- Only burn clean, dry firewood, and always have water close by to put out the fire. Easy options for this are your watering hose or a bucket of water.
- Finally, never leave a firepit unattended. Call 911 to report an out-of-control fire, and 311 to report a firepit complaint. Make sure no fire bans are in effect before starting a fire.

Firepit hours are restricted in Calgary – visit calgary.ca/firepits for details, rules, and restrictions.

Did you know that part of your yard is made up of rights-of-way, and your property line doesn't begin at the edge of the road or sidewalk closest to your home?

As a homeowner, you are responsible for mowing and general maintenance, but it is technically the road right-of-way and is considered public land.
