Capital Conservation Grant Approved

Total project cost = \$75,219.90 and funded at 75% for total funding of \$56,414.93

Organizational Health Assessment Tool & Service Measures Survey are now open!

The 2021 Organizational Health Assessment Tool (OHAT) and Service Measures Survey (SM) are now open! The purpose of these tools is to identify current organizational health, sustainability and services provided to the community. These surveys are voluntary, but we hope that NPCs and community associations/social recreation groups will work together to submit information on the 2020 calendar year. We know that 2020 has been a difficult year for groups and that results may be very different from previous years. Our goal is to gather information that will assist us in telling the collective story. The findings of these surveys may assist our leadership and Council in making decisions and funding choices. Individual group information will not be shared publicly but aggregated results may be included in the annual audit report presented to Council in late fall.

Inspiring Neighbourhood Grant (ING)

The Inspiring Neighbourhood Grant Social and Recreation Program stream remains open for applications until September 30, 2021. As a reminder you have one year to use any approved funding so please consider applying for funding for eligible programs you are considering running between now and Summer 2022. Groups who successfully applied for ING in 2021 must submit their final reporting prior to being eligible for next year's funding. Please watch for the re-opening of this grant to all funding streams in early 2022.



ENMAX Community Solar Fund – Invitation to Participate

The City of Calgary is excited to announce that the ENMAX Community Solar Fund is now open for interested community associations across the city to register! The ENMAX Community Solar Fund is a partnership between The City and ENMAX to deliver \$5-million of solar energy installations at community buildings across Calgary.

Active Transportation Fund – Opening Soon

Infrastructure Canada - Canada's First National Active Transportation Strategy

What types of projects does the ATF support?

Funding is available for planning and design projects, as well as capital projects.

Planning Projects

Grants of up to \$50,000 are available for successful applicants who wish to undertake planning, design or stakeholder engagement activities. Funding can cover up to 100% of eligible costs.

Capital Projects

Contributions are available for capital projects that build new or enhance existing active transportation infrastructure, or which provide ancillary features and facilities that promote active transportation or enhance user safety and security.
