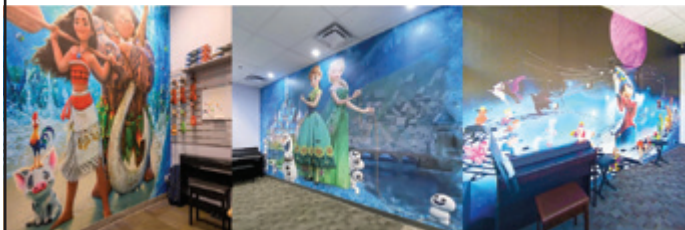

Dalhousie Crime Activity Update

Dalhousie Crime Activity was Down in July 2021

The Dalhousie community experienced 11 crimes in July 2021, in comparison to 14 crimes the previous month, and 12 crimes in July one year ago. Dalhousie experiences an average of 12.8 crimes per month. On an annual basis, Dalhousie experienced a total of 153 crimes as of July 2021, which is up 3% in comparison to 149 crimes as of July 2020. Total Dalhousie crimes is calculated as the sum of break and enters (dwelling, commercial, and other premises), theft from vehicles, theft of vehicles, assaults (nondomestic), commercial robberies, street robberies, and non-domestic 'other' violence.

Thanksgiving

Thanksgiving is October 11 this year in Canada – hopefully we will be able to enjoy it without restrictions this year! Thanksgiving is a time of year that many Canadians often celebrate with a Turkey dinner with family, friends, and those in the community. Did you know that the first national Thanksgiving in Canada was celebrated in the Province of Canada in 1859. It was organized by leaders of the Protestant clergy, who adopted the holiday of American Thanksgiving, which was first observed in 1777 and established as a national day of “public thanksgiving and prayer” in 1789. In Canada, the holiday was intended for the “public and solemn” recognition of God’s mercies.

Thanksgiving is an official statutory holiday in all provinces and territories except Prince Edward Island, New Brunswick, and Nova Scotia. It is called Action de grâce in Quebec and is celebrated to a much lesser extent there than in the rest of the country, given the holiday’s Protestant origins and Anglo-nationalist associations. The main differences among the other provinces tend to concern the dishes that are served with the meal. For example, Jiggs’ dinner is often preferred over turkey in Newfoundland. Pumpkin pie is a common dessert nationally, but there are also regional favorites, such as Nanaimo bars in British Columbia and butter tarts in Ontario.

Some have argued that the ceremony of giving thanks celebrated was not a “real” Thanksgiving. The argument comes from the reason for giving thanks; that the holiday can only be associated with the celebration of the harvest. Europeans who brought the tradition to North America did mark the day by giving thanks for a successful harvest. However, the Canadian and American holidays are not restricted to harvest activities and have become a day for gathering family to give thanks for their general well-being. In that sense, one might observe that the tradition has come full circle.

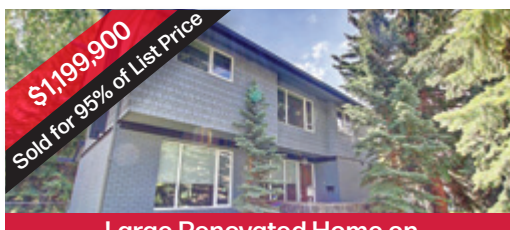
