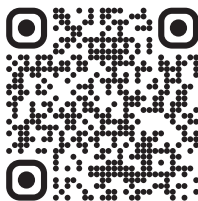

# DCA PD Committee Ride and Discussion with Bike Calgary and City of Calgary



The Dalhousie Community Association Planning and Development Committee (“PD Committee”) wants to ensure all ages and abilities of residents and visitors are safe and feel comfortable traveling within our community or accessing nearby amenities, whether they are walking, cycling, driving, or taking transit.

On September 10, members of the PD Committee met with representatives of Bike Calgary, a cycling advocacy group, for a bike ride through Dalhousie. We wanted to see with our own eyes, as well as through the fresh eyes of people living outside of our community, the experience of a cyclist riding through Dalhousie, especially from a safety perspective. While a certain level of cycling infrastructure already exists in Dalhousie, members of the PD Committee noted biking infrastructure that currently exists in Varsity and Brentwood ended or was considerably more limited as a cyclist enters Dalhousie.

We started at the Dalhousie Station bike lockers/passenger drop-off loop, traveled over the shared-use (pedestrians and cyclists) LRT station bridge into Varsity, and then back over the green space shared-use bridge to the east that connects Varsity to Dalhousie. We continued east on the shared-use path that runs through the green space by the new condo tower development, over to Canadian Tire and Vistaview apartments, and then over the shared-use bridge to Northland Mall. After crossing the parking lot at the NW corner of Northland Mall, we traveled east on 52 Avenue (past A&W and CIBC bank) and onto the bike lane on northbound Northland Drive.

We then crossed back over Shaganappi into Dalhousie, continued on the shared-use pathway to Dalton Drive, and then rode with traffic on Dalhousie Drive (signed bike route) to the green space north of the tennis courts. Traveling up the greenspace, we looked at connections to Dalhousie Elementary and St. Dominic Elementary, before continuing west on the shared-use path running



parallel to Dalhart Road behind the residences, crossing over 53 Street to West Dalhousie to look at connections to H.D. Cartwright Junior High and Dalhousie Community Centre. Following the pathway to its terminus at Dalcastle Drive, we then traveled south to 66 Avenue to consider the shared-use paths that connect Dalhousie to Ranchlands and Silver Springs. Traveling back east on 66 Ave, we looked at the connection

to West Dalhousie Elementary and then continued along Dalhousie Drive to 53 Street before the final leg of our journey along 53 Street into Varsity and then back to our Dalhousie Station LRT starting point, mostly riding in mixed traffic, aside from a brief section of bike lane along 53 Street and the pathway connection along the Groves development, both in Varsity.

After the ride, we met with a manager from the City of Calgary’s Infrastructure Services Department to give an overview of our observations and discuss ways to advocate for improved cycling and pedestrian safety and access. Challenges include prioritizing areas of highest need, vying for City budget monies for any capital projects, and balancing the needs of all residents (motorists, cyclists, pedestrians) when planning any changes/improvements.

In the near-term we see opportunities to address areas of immediate need. This includes:

- Better signage and markings to improve safety and access for pedestrians and cyclists
- Ensuring that road crossings safely accommodate cycling
- Strengthening development along “desire lines” (the most obvious/direct connection between point A and point B) to meet active travel needs are met and improve community connectivity.

The population of Calgary continues to grow and, with initiatives like the City’s Transit-Oriented Development (TOD) plan, increased density will continue to occur in Dalhousie. With increased density will come increased demand on our streets and pathways. Providing viable alternatives, supported by local amenities, will help keep our streets moving and ensure Dalhousie remains a safe, attractive community in which to live and thrive.

## News from the Friends of Nose Hill

The Nose Hill Park household survey reported that informal recreation and the natural environment should be supported by natural gravel or asphalt pathways, for use by seniors, bicycles, and mobility-impaired visitors. The Nose Hill Plan asked how to explain park management, public stewardship, natural history, geology, and human history related to the park.

Information on habitat is about controlled burns, mowing, restoration, rehabilitation, weed and erosion control, dog use zones, and bike use zones. Natural history of fire and bison grazing and endangered habitats are Fescue Grasslands, Aspen forests for wildlife breeding and escape areas, ponds, or wetlands. The geology offers sandstone/shale bedrock, gravels deposited by one million-year-old rivers, Glacial Lake Calgary, and beach lines at the southwest part of the hill. There's much to be learned from archaeology.

Aboriginal use of Nose Hill was as a quarrying site for making tools; a regional lookout for games, enemies, traders; as campsites with fire-shattered rock and stone circles.

There could be an interpretive trail with displays at the main entrances and signs for the glacial erratic and beach line. Trail guides (signs along the trail) or at the main trail heads will require maintenance, servicing, and replacement costs due to vandalism. The Friends of Nose Hill may recruit volunteers to maintain/change the signs on a seasonal basis. Wheelchair accessible signs will be angled to permit reading by walking visitors. However, the visual impact of signs on the nature of open grassland was a concern.

Other ideas were hiring a full-time seasonal park naturalist; information packages for elementary school teachers containing selected walk themes, a list of materials, and a mini field guide with maps; and brochures at the park, despite the ongoing expense of pamphlet production and distribution.

We are now accepting donations for the Prasad Panda Food Drive at the DCA Centre and will continue until November 11, 2022. We have boxes in the foyer where you can drop off your donations. Items in most demand are canned fish (salmon or tuna), canned chicken, and canned meat (ham or Spam). Items that are always welcome are cereal, canned soup, and dry or canned pasta (lasagna, spaghetti, fettuccini, linguini, macaroni, rigatoni, etc.).

Items are not limited to food. Toiletries like toothpaste, toothbrushes, soap, shampoo, deodorant, shaving razors, shaving cream, and lip balm are welcome donations. So are diapers, sanitary pads, wipes, and toilet paper.

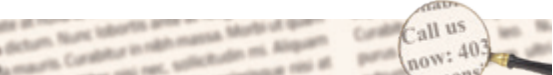

Alberta is once again a top destination for investment capital from around the world.

The latest example of this is airplane manufacturing giant De Havilland announcing it is building a massive manufacturing plant and aerodrome in Wheatland County, just east of Calgary.

Dubbed 'De Havilland Field,' the new facility will be located between Chestermere and Strathmore, where the company has purchased more than 600 hectares of land. The new De Havilland plant will support at least 1,500 high-paying manufacturing jobs once it is completed, and hundreds of construction jobs as it is being built.

The De Havilland announcement follows several other landmark investments from major companies like Amazon, Dow Chemical, HBO, Air Products, Northern Petrochemical, and Walmart. These companies are investing more than \$10 billion into projects across Alberta, which will employ tens-of-thousands of Albertans for generations to come.

As more jobs are created, however, more skilled workers are needed to fill them, and right now Alberta is estimated to have more than 100,000 job vacancies. To help address these labour challenges, our government has launched a new advertising campaign called "Alberta is Calling" to highlight all the benefits of living and working in Alberta as opposed to cities like Toronto and Vancouver.

A new agreement between Alberta's government and the Alberta Medical Association (AMA) that will see the government invest an estimated \$750 million to stabilize the health-care system has been ratified by physicians throughout the province.

Alberta physicians will see an average rate increase of 4% over the four-year term. This is in line with other recent public sector agreements. There will be larger average increases for specialties facing greater pressures such as family medicine, which will see an average effective increase of 5.25% when the value of other investments is factored in.
